2024-25 REGION VII TOM MAYER AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

ABOUT THE TOM MAYER AWARD

Thomas K. Mayer contributed to the well-being of children and families throughout his 35 year career, beginning with the Peace Corps in the 1960's and continuing through his retirement in 2004. Tom was a committed leader serving as the Region VII Director of the Office of Community Operations, Administration for Children and Families (ACF), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Tom's living legacy includes a commitment to all in the area of advancing early care and education and specifically to Head Start programs in the ongoing effort to achieve and maintain high-quality service delivery. During his thirty-plus years with ACF, Mr. Mayer led the development of lasting federal, state, and local partnerships that continue to serve in the expansion of children and families receiving Head Start/ Early Head Start services across Region VII.

Individuals nominated for this prestigious award should have demonstrated flexibility in their career and have documented experiences across the Head Start Program. Consideration will be given to individuals who made a long-term state or regional impact, as well as those who possess key characteristics of good leadership. Leadership examples include articulating a clear vision regarding a system for early care and education, the highest degree of integrity in their representation of Head Start, and demonstrated ability to build strong relationships and partnerships that serve to further the comprehensive nature of Head Start services to children and families. In addition, the nominee should have a demonstrated compassion and commitment to future Head Start program improvement and quality on a continuing basis.

ANN LINEHAN SAFETY AWARD



The Region VII Head Start Association (R7HSA) established the Ann Linehan Safety Award in honor of Ms. Linehan on the announcement of her 2021 retirement as the Deputy Director of the Office of Head Start, ending her longstanding career with the Administration for Children and Families.

One only has to read Ms. Linehan's letter to grantees dated January 3, 2018, to understand the depth of her concern and passion for providing children a safe, nurturing, and loving environment. The letter attached to this application packet contains a difficult but important message shared with grantees regarding an alarming increase in reported number of child incidents while children were in the care of a Head Start/Early Head Start Program.

The Ann Linehan Safety Award builds on the R7HSA Safe in Hand Campaign launched in 2019 in response to Ms. Linehan's letter for the purpose of raising awareness and the importance of providing a safe indoor and outdoor classroom setting including transportation services, where provided, for every child handed off by a parent/caregiver to a Head Start/Early Head Start staff member is always the programs highest priority.

2022 marks the first year the Ann Linehan Safety Award was open for applications. The award will continue to be offered annually and awarded at an R7HSA annual event contingent upon receipt of qualifying recipient applications.

Award submissions will be reviewed by an impartial panel of experienced Head Start/Early Head Start professionals with former or current direct field program supervisory/management level experience.

ANN LINEHAN SAFETY AWARD

CRITERIA: Criteria for the award is set at the highest level in an effort to recognize a recipient who has demonstrated the following:

- 1. The recipient meets and exceeds 45 CFR §1302.47 of the Head Start Program Performance Standards by establishing a system of health and safety practices ensuring children are kept safe at all times.
- 2. The recipient can describe how they have exercised due diligence in their response to serving infants, toddler, children, and families mitigating the spread of communicable diseases.
- 3. The recipient meets state Child Care licensing regulations.
- 4. The recipient has been incident free for the last twelve months and has not been cited as non-compliant on their most current Focus Area Two 2 monitoring review in respect to Performance Measure 4 (PM4) Safety Practices.
- 5. For programs involved in child care partnerships, please describe how your program has successfully supported partners in providing safe and developmentally appropriate environments designed to protect the health and safety of children, families, and staff. Please expand on resources, professional development, including partners in program planning activities as well as other direct support your program has provided to ensure they are successful in implementing comprehensive services that promote the well-being of all children in your care.

In addition to the criteria previously listed, the recipient must include a one-to-two-page self-reflection narrative describing how their program has used innovation to go beyond regulations and requirements, while exercising diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) mirroring the message in Ms. Linehan's January 3, 2018, letter, "Keeping Every Child safe, and feeling loved Every Moment while in our care, which is foundational to Head Start and Early Head Start programs."
